Special Rapporteur on Violence Against Women (see her 2000 Report under UN Documents): "One of the most noteworthy products of a collaborative process by the Global Alliance against Traffic in Women, the Foundation against Trafficking in Women and Global Rights (formerly the International Human Rights Law Group) is the Human Rights Standards for the Treatment of Trafficked Persons (January 1999). "The

Standards are drawn from international human rights instruments and formally recognized international legal norms. They aim to protect and promote respect for the human rights of individuals who have been victims of trafficking, including those who have been subjected to involuntary servitude, forced labour and/or slavery-like practices.” The Special Rapporteur would encourage Governments to utilize the Human Rights Standards in creating new policies and laws. She would encourage the international community to do the same.” (para. 106)
